







Quick Guide: Private / Incognito Browsing

Sometimes you don't want your browsing history saved — maybe you're logging into a shared device or just need extra privacy. A private/incognito window is the simplest way. Here's how:

Mac (macOS)	Windows (PC)
 Chrome Shortcut: ⌘ + Shift + N Menu: ⌘ → New Incognito Window	 Chrome Shortcut: Ctrl + Shift + N Menu: ⌘ → New Incognito Window
 Safari Shortcut: ⌘ + Shift + N Menu: File → New Private Window	 Edge Shortcut: Ctrl + Shift + N Menu: ⌘ → New InPrivate Window
 Firefox Shortcut: ⌘ + Shift + P Menu: ⌘ → New Private Window	 Firefox Shortcut: Ctrl + Shift + P Menu: ⌘ → New Private Window

Helpful Reminders

- Close the private window completely when finished.
- Always log out of accounts on shared computers.
- Private browsing clears local history but doesn't hide activity from your network or university.

■ Tip: If you forget the shortcut, use your browser's menu — the option will say "Private Window" or "Incognito."
